One of the things on our bucket-list has been to go to Falling Waters which is a home built over a waterfall by a renowned architect Frank Lloyd Wright for the Kaufmanns Family

This home was designed & constructed in 1935

Completed in 1936. The estimated cost was \$30K which blew out to \$100K. Back in those days that was a really lot of money. This home is maintained today by The Western Pennsylvanian Conservatory.



Everything in the home is kept to its 1935 original state. It is on a 5000 acre plot and is absolutely breathtaking to visit, put it on your bucket list.

It is hard to believe that somebody back in 1935 could conceive, let alone build out of concrete, this building.







The Kaufmann family wanted to have access to the water fall, these stairs lead direct from the lounge room to the waterfall. When the fall is in flood the water level will rise five steps up the stairway.





From Falling Waters we then moved on to Flight 93 National Memorial. This once again, is a very humbling site, Wendy and I last year did the 911 site in NY, we experienced quite a strange thing on one of the guided tours in NY where were taken to the American Express building, which is nowhere near the 911 site, but unfortunately, on that day, they had staff in the first building, having a meeting when the tragedy happened.

In the foyer of their building, they have a memorial to their lost employees, one was <u>Sigrid Charlotte Wiswe</u> Her name kept on appearing to us at the footprint of the site as well as the photo wall of all the victims. Once again her name appeared on the Wall of Names at the 93 site, this particular, on her memorial at the American Express Bldg said that "she loved cats" Wendy also loves cats, so seem to have a connection with each other.

The biggest bar of Kit Kat we've ever seen.






Moving on to South Hannover, we went to the AACA Museum, they have a complete range of the Tucker car, which was far ahead of it's time.




As you turned the steering wheel on the Tucker the centre light would turn to the direction you were heading

Bill was the organizer of NCRS Road Tours prior to Scott & Kay Sinclair who are doing it now.










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They have left an inspection shaft so they can keep an eye on the erosion that is still happening under the central cone of the museum exhibition.

One of the options you can do with your new corvette, is to have a museum delivery, this is where they pre deliver the car on site and you take possession of it in the Museum.


As you can see in these photos there are 8 cars in the main entrance and another 12 cars in the Crèche, all ready for their owners to take them home.





Amateur Tech Report

AMATEUR TECH REPORT - Geoff Cooper

As you would all know, the cabins in Corvette's, get extremely hot. Well nothing has changed over the years.

My 2006 C6, gets uncomfortable to drive without the air conditioner on. The temperature, from the exhaust through the tunnel, can rise 20 deg, within 30 minutes highway driving.

I jumped on the computer, and found what I was looking for, from Corvette Central. The order was placed with the delivery made to our hotel in Las Vegas, where Angie and I, along with Murray and Wendy, attended the NCRS National Convention. What a fantastic trip and experience that was. Murray and Wendy will no doubt, give you all the details of the road tour and convention, in this newsletter.

Anyway back to the heat barrier installation.

After 4 weeks back from USA I finally found time to attempt the install. I opened the box and began to read the instructions. **OH SHIT**, what have I got myself into, as I continued to read the steps involved. Here is an overview.

Step 1.

Raise vehicle on hoist to a comfortable working height. Remove intermediate exhaust pipes, to access tunnel - as per workshop manual on removal procedure. Luckily I also purchased a 4 book set of workshop manuals for the car, again from Corvette Central which only added another 22kgs to our luggage, for our flight home.

Step 2.

Clean tunnel and sides, ensure that all areas are dirt and grease free, before applying self adhesive heat barrier.

Step 3.

Reinstall intermediate exhaust pipes, using new gaskets and support brackets, as the old brackets had to be cut and grounded off the mufflers etc.



I was definitely not prepared or willing to grind and cut away the exhaust to install a heat shield. Frustrated and annoyed, that I had purchased a product, which appeared to be an easy exercise.

OBJECTIVE

How to get tunnel mat installed, on the tunnel plate without removing, exhaust pipes. Keep in mind having only a 40mm clearance from side wall of tunnel, and a 25mm gap, between tunnel plate and top of exhaust.

SOLUTION

Get the wife involved. Why you ask??? Simple small hands and DEFINITELY, more patience than I have. Anyway, first things first. Trace out a template of the pieces as the chance of a stuff up, had just increased, having limited room to apply the self adhesives shield.

Step 1.

Clean tunnel and sides, ensure that all areas are dirt and grease free, before applying self adhesive heat barrier.

Step2.

Roll out tunnel shield and carefully, thread over top of exhaust pipe.

Step 3.

Peel back protective plastic cover form the adhesive backing. This is where, it becomes tedious, as we were rolling plastic backing on itself, while pressing the shield into position and only having 25mm of clearance, between top of exhaust and bottom of tunnel plate.

The kit came with a small roller to press shield into place. Unfortunately with the pipes in place another type of tool was required. After searching through the garage, and then the kitchen utensil draw, for an appropriate alternative, to the roller.





I would bend a piece of 20mm electrical conduit and also a 1/2" copper pipe into a hook.

With these new tools, I was able to get over the top of the exhaust pipes, and press and knead shield into place.





Job completed and it only took 3 hours. Geoff

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
