




We were lucky to have twin sportsman C4's Richard and Ross

The Museum was founded in 1987 and showcases over 50 vehicles from 1915 onwards.

They also have an extensive collection of speed cars from Claremont Speedway during the 1950's and 1960's.

Owners Ron West & Ron Meredith's long association first began in 1957 with the owning and racing of a 1934 Ford Coupe at Forrestfield Speedway where cars from the 1930's and 1940's were converted into hot rods and raced until totally destroyed.

Their aim is the preservation and restoration of these and many more vehicles so that future generations and motor enthusiasts can re-discover Western Australia's motoring history.

Unfortunately only one Corvette could be found and that was in a picture hanging above the Juke Box in the diner.




The Motley Crew, Murray Wendy, Pam and Scott at Hoover Dam

Now back in Vegas, when we received the sad news about the Paris Terror attack, the Eiffel Tower here was shut down and all lights switched off in respect for the victims.



To our surprise we woke up to snow, it had snowed over night.








This is a shot from the Stratosphere looking down, its approx 850ft in the air.


We all decided to take this once in a lifetime opportunity to night dive and swim with Manta rays, what a fantastic experience.

CAR OF THE MONTH

THE CORVETTE DREAM

Well..... As a kid all of 12 years of age, back in 1963, I wasn't having Corvette dreams. But I did get my first Corvette. An unusual colour red, inclusive of pop up lights & the must have rear split window. This Corvette was produced by "Corgi".

Some 30 years later I did start to get the Corvette dreams. At the time thinking C4. Whilst saving, kicking tyres & inspecting conversion shops for a few years, the C4 thinking stopped early 1996. With the news of the C5 going into production for the 1996 November release, I held back the adrenaline & paid a deposit in February of 1997 for a C5 factory order. Due to supply problems the C5 wasn't built until October, then becoming a '98.

My new C5 was the 3rd converted by Corvette Clinic, the first registered C5 in NSW & the first in the NSW Corvette Club.

On Easter Monday after the 2013 National Corvette Convention in Toowoomba Qld, I met up with Ray Costa in Brisbane & checked out his Mongoose Grand Sport replica Corvette. Shortly after my return home my C5 of almost 16 years went on the market & found a good home in Adelaide.

So..... the 2nd Corvette dream commences. A '63 Grand Sport replica was now on the schedule with many, many hours of research, I narrowed the build down to five options, all in the U.S.

(For those who don't know, Chevrolet commenced production of the GS to fight off the all conquering Ford Cobra's of the era. GM pulled the pin on Motorsport & Duntov completed 5 x GS's

in the back sheds of the GM plant unbeknown to the Management. These GS's where then leased/loaned to different race teams. These 5 GS's are now valued in excess of \$10 million U.S. Dollars each).

My five options were: Duntov, Superformance, Mid America Industries, Mongoose & Lucky Restorations. Almost immediately the Duntov & Superformance, whilst quality vehicles were not feasible due to their high cost.

So trip # 17 to the U.S. comes up & 5 weeks tripping about doing Corvette & Motorsport stuff before Di arrives & meeting up in Houston TX.

Jeff Leach of Mid-America Industries in nth-western IL, was very tempting. Inclusive of the 4" tubular chassis, C4 suspension & brakes & the trusted Dana 44. Multiple engine choices were also available.

Gary Krause of Mongoose in Mid-OH had similar options to that of MAI.

Seth Wood from Lucky's Restorations in northern AL, offered a Streetshop modern C2 box chassis C6 suspension & brakes, tough gearbox, & a diff rated @ 1000hp. A crate LS3 was recommended.


I lost interest in MAI as their shop was full of junk, many unfinished projects, floods & the doubt that they could build a GS in a reasonable amount of time. During this trip I leant that monies had been paid by clients, nothing produced, clients pulling their stuff out of the shop & going to Mongoose to complete the build. This I didn't need!

Mongoose whilst having a proven product, have a fibreglass body shell & not a donor steel birdcage & sadly 30 year old technology C4 suspension & brakes. Suspension arms are difficult to come by & the Dana 44 diff again is outdated.

At Lucky's the Streetshop chassis is a class act. This is where I had my GS built. The idea of the C6 suspension was dropped, so I opted to go C7, including C7ZO6 brakes & wheel dimensions. Donor birdcage, original C2 doors, Hammerhead diff, LS3 6.2 crate with 525hp. As the GS will not be a highway car I opted to go Tremec 5speed beefed up, rather than the much heavier & larger 6spd. Had I used the 6spd we would have had to make many floor modifications then this limited the seat choices. At the moment the GS weighs in at 1160 kg. This will increase once the seats, wiring, lighting, radio, seatbelts, go in. So potentially the all up weight of GS will be approximately 1250 kg.

The GS is being built to the current 2015/2016 ADR rules. This includes major chassis strengthening for the seats & the installation of intrusion bars to the doors. Hopefully the GS is running by the time we go to Bendigo for 2016 NCC Easter next year. But not likely to be registered before then.




