



This is the cost of car and accommodation for the return trip 3/4/23





On arrival, we will collect the cars and drive to a unique little town called Sheffield where all the buildings are covered in murals, we will stop for morning tea there.





After the train trip, we will travel towards Hobart, stopping at Derwent Bridge




where we will view The Wall in The Wilderness, this is the work of one man who has carved the most incredible sculptures that you will ever see. So bring your cameras.










# **DAY 8:** April 3<sup>rd</sup>. 2023

# Gary Cowans 65 L78

#### Part of the history of Gary Cowans car

Morris Bussey, the restorer of my 65 L78 attended the 1991 Bloomington Gold Corvette Special Collection VIII show as there was a 65 L78 submitted for the Benchmark award, and they offered a Corvette College on Corvette restoration.


In 1991, Bloomington Gold introduced the ultimate and most difficult judging category - The BENCHMARK Award. To achieve BENCHMARK status, an unrestored Corvette must attain GOLD Certification and excel in all four categories of SURVIVOR during the same weekend.

Morris completed the restoration of my 65 L78 in 1996 and it achieved Top Flight at the NCRS Regional Judging Meet at Waco Texas on 12 October 1996.

When I was checking the documentation passed on to me by Morris, I found at the 1991 Bloomington Gold program which had been autographed by Zora!

Perhaps Morris met Zora at the show.

Sadly, Zora passed away on April 26, 1996.





# Southern Arizona Body Lift

On May 28<sup>th</sup>, members of the chapter participated in a judging school hosted by Bill Hurley and Tom Kumisca on Judging Engines using CDCIF. The event was attended by Bob Jost, Pat Garland, Jay Cochran, Craig Schultz and Jeff Schaufel. The background for this event is that Bill Hurley was completing a frame-off restoration of a 1966 Corvette for a colleague that he worked with at the fire department in Salem, OR. It was clear that Bill put a lot of time and effort into the top-quality restoration! Tom Kumisca pointed out key details of the engine and frame to be considered when judging, particularly broach marks on the engine stamp pad. Bill walked us through his comprehensive process to ensure all available numbers were matching. Outside of Bill's shop, the body, having been painted, was on a trolly ready to be mounted to the frame. So, a few of us, Jeff, Bob, Pat and Bill's friend Randy came back to Bill's shop a week later on June 3<sup>rd</sup> to assist with the very delicate task of lowering the body on the frame. As we prepared for the drop, Bill explained that the vehicle had been in a wreck causing significant damage to the passenger side rear area, the frame was actually bent and had to be corrected as well as extensive body work done by Bill prior to painting. Lining up the body to the frame mounts requires a lot of patience and a lot of hands! After a successful drop and tightening of body mount bolts, Bill invited us over to his beautiful patio area for sandwiches and "adult" beverages. We talked about how events like this are what the chapter membership wanted based on the recent survey results – more judging events, judging schools and technical sessions. As for the car, Bill has already registered to have it judged at the Bend, OR Regional NCRS meet in August. We think he'll

do well!


























# 53<sup>rd</sup> Shannon's Classic Car Show
























## **Lancelin Road Tour**


